Advent: Each year, we begin our Advent season with a strong reminder: we are preparing ourselves for the return of Jesus who has already come among us, sharing our humanity. We hear St. Paul exhorting us to let the Lord come more fully into our lives this Advent, so that his love in us may increase and overflow into the lives of those around us. We hear Jesus telling us be

vigilant and pray for strength. Do not let your heart become distracted by the anxieties of daily life. We all know how easy it is to become frightened and anxious as we look around us and see the signs of our times. There is much happening in our world and in our own lives - that can distress us. That is why Jesus encourages us to stand erect and raise our heads. Our redemption is at hand. Advent is a season of waiting, a season of expectant hope. As disciples of Jesus, our waiting is always active and alert. We are looking for Jesus wherever he wants to be found. We must learn to discipline ourselves daily and to be aware of Jesus within us then we can reach out in loving kindness to anyone who needs to experience God's loving presence in their lives. We have to be accepting and thankful whenever Jesus chooses to surprise us with his love given through others.

This discipline of vigilant waiting only happens when we choose to be prayerful in our daily living. Perhaps this Advent season could be well spent learning this prayerful discipline. It is not difficult. All we must do is choose to take a few moments several times each day to be aware and thankful for Jesus' great love within us. That awareness and our thankfulness will make it easier to choose to reach out with Jesus' love to those around us. As we learn this discipline, we will understand why we can be confident in the face of the distress in our world. Jesus' love within us makes us ready whenever he chooses to return. — Oblates.org

Candle 5 ("Christ's candle") is white, lit on Christ-• mas Eve or Christmas Day, and represents the Advent child, Jesus
