



# February 16, 2025

Today we hear the famous Sermon on the Mount and the Beatitudes which offer us profound insights into a life of service, forgiveness and love. The Beatitudes are not passive ideals, but a call to actively cultivate these virtues in daily life, highlighting that true happiness and fulfillment lie in following a righteous path even when facing hardship.

Then Jesus looked up at his disciples and said: Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the Prophets. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who are laughing now, or you will mourn and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false Prophets. (Living with Christ website) You can think of the beatitudes as a great song which calls us to a life of virtue, reflection and total surrender to God's will.

It is Christ's song which calls us to trust firmly in God, while looking forward to eternity. These blessings are for those who are totally and willingly ready to place everything in God's hands. They also remind us that all we do here on earth will gain us eternal life. That is, if we do them well and for the sake of God. The good news for us today is simple, nothing in this world can rob us of our peace of mind and interior joy, because our trust is not in this world, nor in man. Rather, our trust is in the crucified and risen Christ, the saviour and hope of the world. The psalmist summarized this good news for us: "Happy the man who has placed his trust in the Lord."


